Junction area sidewalk work gets approved

The West Toronto Junction Team's Henry Calderon, project director of business development, confirmed that Heintzman Street sidewalks will be reconstructed before the end of the year.

Residents feared their sidewalks would remain in a sorry, but more importantly a dangerous state when they heard their road was to be used as a construction route for NEXXT Development, the corporation behind a condominium building to be built at the old Canadian Tire site at Dundas and Keele streets.

The city did not want to put in new asphalt only to see it damaged by trucks, but Calderon confirmed the city would go ahead with sidewalk improvements.
